### DEAR PARENTS, """



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Who could have imagined, as we bentched over our Menorahs only a year ago, that the brachah "בימים ההם בזמן הזה" would take on such tragic significance this Chanukah?

Who could have imagined that we would once again become a tormented nation, the victims of Holocaust like barbarism?

Who could have imagined the blatant antisemitism that is infecting our world, more contagious than a deadly virus?

As I pen this letter, there are no words that can adequately encapsulate the horrific course of global events. Whenever we are at a loss, we look to our holy *Torah* for direction. Having recently concluded *Chanukah*, our takeaway is captured in just **one** word: The *ZAYIS*, the olive.

"למה נמשלו ישראל לזית? לומר לך: מה זית אינו מוציא שמנו אלא על ידי כתיתה אף ישראל אין חוזרין למוטב אלא ע"י יסורין" (מנחות, נג ע"ב).

Bnei Yisrael are likened to an olive. The more the olive is squeezed, it expresses quality oil. The more the Yidden are battered and tormented, instead of losing hope, the purest middos emanate from within.

The *Rebbe* paved the way for survival by creating a lifeline through the *Mivtzoim*. We could not have fathomed how they would become the platform and basis of our present-day spiritual warfare. Previously non-observant Jews are now embracing *Neiros* and *Shmiras Shabbos*, giving their lives meaning. Unaffiliated soldiers are proudly donning *tefillin* and *tzitzis*, acknowledging that this is their primary ammunition. Former atheists are passionately reciting the *Shema* and the sacred *tefillos* that infuse us with strength in times of travesty. *Mezuzos* are being affixed to provide G-dly protection. *Mivtzah Sefer Torah* is going strong. *Tzedakah* is being dispensed in abundance. *Mivtzah Kashrus* has taken on a new dimension, as soldiers are being provided with nourishing meals *Min Hamehadrin*.

Divisiveness has disappeared. Instead of internal strife, we are now experiencing unprecedented *Achdus*. *Chareidim* of all stripes and colors are supporting our soldiers in every way possible. All barriers of judgment have fallen; we have become ONE.

Here at Bais Rivkah, our teachers are once again tasked with the monumental responsibility of guiding and supporting our students through most trying times. The curriculum that they so painstakingly created at the beginning of the school year has taken on a new dimension.

The Alter Rebbe guides us: "Men darf leben mit der tzeit". Our contemporary challenges and their solutions are clearly sourced in the Parshas Hashavuah. Our curriculum has been tailored to impart that to our students.

When the *Rebbe* launched *Tzivos Hashem*, little did we comprehend the *Rebbe's* keen foresight that our children would live through times of war. Our students have been empowered to become true soldiers by increasing in *Torah* and *Tefillah* as the real weapons of a *Yid*.

Tinokos Shel Bais Rabon each have a rank and mission of what they can do to facilitate victory. As our teachers educate our students on the magnitude of the disasters we are experiencing, they also strive to cushion and buffer them how to live with *Bitachon* and resilience, without trauma.

#### PRE-1A ארץ ישראל FOR תהילים

In Pre-1A, we say extra **תהילים** and **דאווען** every day that ה' should keep the ארץ ישראל in ארץ ישראל and everywhere else safe. We had a special program with Morah Zeesy from Zappy By Zeesy in honor of the ארץ ישראל in ארץ ישראל. The מיידעלאך sang the 12 חיות with חיות, said צדקה, and gave צדקה. Then we packed gift packages with crafts and games, to be shipped directly to families that are currently relocated to different areas in ארץ ישראל. We're so happy to send the message of love from our students to the children.

Pre-1A also joined the community-wide campaign to say שבת מברכים on שבת מברכים as a זכות for the ארץ ישראל in ארץ ישראל. Although the Pre-1A students are still learning how to read, the מיידעלאך know that the תפילות of children have extra power! In addition to these class commitments, our JEP heads. Altie and Mushki, provide weekly challenges for students to embrace. The students are eager to witness the impact their החלטות have in fortifying the three pillars upon which our world stands, ensuring safety for the front-line soldiers.

Students have the opportunity to symbolize their החלטה on a paper shield. 'ברוך ה, our ארץ, ישראל bulletin board is nearing completion, adorned with depictions of all our positive resolutions and commitments. Through this, our Bais Rivkah Elementary girls are illuminating the world and ensuring victory over our enemies.





#### **HIGHSCHOOL** LEARNING FOR ארץ ישראל

In the wake of the unspeakable tragedy in ארץ ישראל, a special unity event was coordinated for all high schools in Crown Heights. Girls joined to say תהילים for the safety of the אידן in ארץ ישראל. The girls were addressed by Mrs. Dina Gorkin regarding their emotional wellbeing during these challenging times, and then by Rabbi Yossi Paltiel, who shared how to follow the Rebbe's directives during a time of war. After that, a חת״ת campaign was launched, with hundreds of girls committing to saying חת״ת for the safety of ארץ ישראל. The girls then joined together in uplifting song.

As the war in ארץ ישראל continues to be fought on all fronts, students have been given the opportunity to learn more about the history of ארץ ישראל, our connection to the land, and the Rebbe's response to events that have happened there.

Mrs. Esther Piekarski from Tel Aviv gave highschool students a glimpse of the situation from the lens of a שלוחה from the lens of ארץ ישראל. #### CREATIVE WRITING- LEVELED UP

Creative Writing is an important form of self-expression, developed and practiced in grades 1-3. Through journaling, our first graders proudly learn to formulate sentences. Second graders excitedly move onto writing more descriptive sentences, expressing their thoughts with proper grammar as they perfect their handwriting. Our third graders, now "authors in training," carefully structure paragraphs that provide them with the opportunity to express their unique thoughts and creativity.

In conjunction with *The Marvelous משיח To Bring משיח* program, primary students worked on writing pieces conveying what they learned about the מידה of **חסד** and the importance of being a **חסד.** 

The writing pieces were proudly displayed on colorfully decorated bulletin boards that adorn our hallways, for teachers and students to read and learn from.

Students in grades 1-3 are proudly supporting our soldiers in ארץ שראל by taking upon themselves extra learning, החלטות טובות, and letter writing. Writing letters to our soldiers connects and gives חיות to both the writer and recipient in a most meaningful way. Our Bais Rivkah students put extra effort into writing letters that are super neat and clear, so that our primarily Israeli speaking soldiers can easily read, enjoy, & and be inspired by our soldiers on the home front, our תנוקות של בית רבן.

#### **ART IN GRADE 3**

Third Grade Art is the beginning of a two-year experience. As we progress, we build up our own collection of artwork celebrating all the knowledge and skills garnered.

The artwork we created for the first element, "Line", involved an introduction to still life by tracing, studying and drawing the vines in a leaf. This is where realism ends and our ability to create begins. We played a game and used invented patterns and personal choice of colors to complete our leaf. We will finish this artwork later this year!

In the future, we will learn the skills of 3D modeling, design, sewing, shading, painting, color combinations, carving and printing, to name a few. We will also be using a multitude of mediums and tools such as paint, ink, pastels, fabric, brayer, charcoal, chalk, clay, and many more along the way.

We learn and we have fun because we own our knowledge and explore a wide range of experiences. This way, we can see what our favorite forms of self expression are. My goal is that art in the art room is a positive experience in a safe space, to help the girls be free to create and selfexpress with confidence and joy.

Every Sunday, a competent group of smiling Bais Rivkah seniors with engaging personalities and youthful energy join grades 1-8 to assist teachers, cover small groups, lead gym class and work 1:1 with students. Throughout the year, teachers and students alike looked forward to seeing and interacting with our special Sunday "teachers!"











#### **OUR MORAHS LEARN, TOO!**

To inspire growth and excellence in our teachers, Bais Rivkah arranged a professional development day for all primary and elementary staff. New skills and perspectives were gained through workshops that were infused with thought provoking topics, relevant for our students in קע"ה multiple departments and classes. A gourmet lunch added to the special atmosphere of unity and pride. Some of the highlights of the PD day included gaining new strategies for fostering self-regulation and a powerful summary of the approach of the חינוך to חינוך. Teachers and administrators alike returned to school empowered to invigorate our students with helpful tools to find inner social, emotional, and academic success.











#### קריאה WORKSHOP

As part of our ongoing effort to improve קריאה instruction in Bais Rivkah, the entire Hebrew primary staff participated in a powerful קריאה workshop presented by Mrs. Tova Rottenberg, קריאה specialist, M.Ed, BCBA, and COBA. Mrs. Rottenberg introduced and presented the 'Gold Standard in קריאה'. This workshop highlighted the pivotal role that the Morah plays in ensuring each child's success, mastering the 6

key elements of a dynamic קריאה lesson, and how to maximize student engagement. This informative and practical workshop was followed up with debriefs for each grade level to collaborate and share ways to implement the new skills as they apply to each individual class and student's needs.

## Elementary GRADES 4-8

#### "CONNECTION" IN GRADES 4-8

Bais Rivkah grades 4-8 have really been living the school's theme of תוופ״ד.

ישראל אורייתא וקודשא בריך הוא כולא חד- CONNECTION

The concept of connection will be incorporated in all our programs, writing contests, and curriculum throughout the school year. It is the focus of our new Sunday תפילה curriculum, beautiful תפילה journal, and a Tefillah connection contest with incentives and prizes, including a beautiful personalized תהילים.

- Every morning, students learn about **תפילה** and **פירוש המילות** with their לימודי קודש teachers. On Sunday mornings before davening, minilessons and round table discussions on תפילה are taught and facilitated by the general studies teachers. Students record what they learned in their special תפילה journals.
- The hallway bulletin boards further enhance the theme of "Connection". The main bulletin board is called "Secure and Unlimited Connections". Each class is represented by one little girl, and the objective is to receive the letters that spell the word תפילה and reach the sky- סלם מצב ארצה וראשו מגיע השמימה. Proper davening is what moves the class along the path to the top: On the wall in each classroom is a monthly chart. It includes a daily checklist which is marked by the teacher running davening. After earning 20 checks, the class receives another letter in the word תפילה.
- A beautiful bulletin board of the בית המקדש graces our hallway. It proudly displays bricks with the names of students who have earned the praise of their teachers and principals for outstanding effort, good behavior, and beautiful מידות. Teachers write a "Positive Office Referral" detailing the achievement of a student. The student is then recognized, and her name is prominently displayed on a brick of our bulletin board. Together, we are building the בית המקדש one brick at a time, and bringing מצוה one מצוה at a time.























#### TAKING LEARNING DEEPER

To truly embrace and forge a connection with our חסידישע ימים טובים, our 5th-grade students actively participate in an enhanced and interactive curriculum. The students are divided into smaller groups, allowing each to explore various facets of each יום טוב's significance. This includes delving into the historical narrative, gaining insights about the 'cr associated with that special day, exploring the ניגונים, taking on החלטות טובות, and engaging in hands-on activities or crafts. This holistic approach is designed to deliver a profound and immersive learning experience, ensuring that the day becomes truly extraordinary for our students.





#### י"ט כסלו

In celebration of י"ט כסלו. special programs were organized for each class. Students were immersed in real, handson learning experiences that brought the story of " $\upsilon$  to life through various engaging activities. The day featured a range of events, including special breakfasts, kumzitz singing, food crafts, escape rooms, candle making, tambourine decorating, and more. As a culmination, the school hosted a school-wide מלוה מלכה on מוצאי שבת, featuring choirs and dances starring our 4th and 5th graders, headed by our talented 8th graders. A beautiful 190 bookmark craft added a creative touch to the event. Students left this evening of unity and joy with a deepened appreciation for the significance of י"ט כסלו.



#### LEARNING הלכה INDEPENDENT

One of our educational objectives is to empower our students to become independent learners. We aim for them to cultivate a sense of ease and familiarity with the text of פרים. This is done in our הלכה classes for grades 5-7, where the students engage in collaborative learning with a חברותא, using our newly redesigned workbook to autonomously delve into the content of the שולחן ערוך of the שולחן ערוך.

As part of this process, students construct a vocabulary of

key words, primarily focusing on fundamental terms from that frequently come up. Supported by a word bank for more challenging terms, and guided questions, partners collaborate to comprehend the הלכה and decipher the content independently. The students often find themselves pleasantly surprised by their ability to understand the material on their own, leading to a sense of pride in their accomplishments.













#### READING COMES TO LIFE

Why was Mrs. Waldman's fourth grade Bais Rivkah classroom transformed into an exclusive restaurant? For their "book tasting" event, of course! Each table represented a different reading genre. Students were invited to each table to browse and sample each style. Reflection napkins were provided at the restaurant for girls to share their opinions and pick their favorite genre. For dessert, the class received beautifully

decorated cupcakes. What an experience!

In other elementary classrooms, reading became a multi-modular experience as students read and analyzed a book in class, and then deepened their understanding by using creative talents to create an exhibit of their book. Mrs. Schusterman's fourth grade class created a "Book in A Box", while Mrs. Srulovic's sixth graders created a 3D model depicting their story

































#### תורה SCIENCE IN תורה הפוך בה והפוך בה, דכולא בה

Everything can be found inside the תורה and Bais Rivkah eighth graders got to experience a live demonstration of that! The eighth grade science curriculum includes the topic of centrifugal force and the concepts of mixing and separating different chemicals and elements. As חנוכה arrived, science and תורה blended in perfect harmony as Rabbi Albukerk of Tzivos Hashem gave a demonstration covering the properties of oil, a centrifuge in action, and the resulting pure oil and its relation to the מנורה. The eighth grade left the workshop enriched, excited and deeply connected to חנוכה like never before.



















#### STUDENTS TODAY, **TEACHERS TOMORROW**

Elementary and High School departments work together to coordinate Bais Rivkah's Sunday Assistant Program. 12th graders are assigned to different elementary classrooms, where they gain the experience of working with students in a real classroom setting.

Student teachers help us accomplish things we ordinarily could not do without the support of a teacher's aide. Some of those tasks include davening with a class so that teachers can attend a meeting, or supervising a class so that the teacher can meet with individual students. Twelfth grade assistants also work with students one on one and in small groups, helping them hone their skills in various subjects. As our twelfth graders get a small taste for teaching, we anticipate welcoming many of our program graduates back as full-time teachers as they choose to make their career in חינוך.

#### וווו פרשה INITIATIVE

New for this year! In the 10th grade פרשה class, students get weekly guided questions on the פרשה and answer them independently by looking inside the פסוקים and provided חיינו.

This valuable exercise has students viewing and going through

the פרשה from inside the text on a weekly basis. It's also been familiarizing our girls with הפסוק, and helping them gain confidence and independent learning skills.















#### RAMBAM MUSEUM TRIP

Students in grades 11 & 12 were taken on a special trip to see the "The Golden Path" Exhibit at the Center for Jewish History in Manhattan. Arranged by **Mrs. E. Lerman**, beloved 11th grade Historia teacher, students got to view this exhibit featuring a private collection of many rare books of the מוער שלים. They were given a booklet with questions to answer as they went through the

exhibit, and the curator of the exhibit gave background on how the museum came to be. At the end, students took a few minutes to learn excerpts of  $\mbox{nm}$  in the museum, along with their grade shluchos. We are so grateful to Mrs. E. Lerman for coordinating this trip, and constantly looking for ways to bring learning to life for our students.











#### LAUNCH אחות התמימם

אחות התמימם is a program geared toward girls looking to learn and grow more in their אידישקייט and אחות. The אחות theme for this year is, "Step It Up- ועשו לי מקדש ושכנתי." The dedicated אחות התמימם presented the concept of how Hashem desires to dwell within each one of us. We can achieve this goal by constantly growing, one step at a time, building a מקדש within ourselves.

This year, אחות התמימים has both paper and online options. The אחות התמימים website offers an abundance of learning resources. Over 530 girls have signed up to join אחות התמימים!









#### G.O. LAUNCH

The energetic, creative G.O. leaders introduced their theme for the year: "סער א וועלט" Make Waves." With the סוס of the 10 מבצעים, we will turn over the world and bring אנבעים. Students were gifted with their very own charm bracelets to wear throughout the year. Each month this year, one of the ten מבצעים will be highlighted, and students will receive a charm that corresponds to the מבצע of the month.

In חשון, the מבצע stressed was p"ש. A massive נש"ק campaign was launched with the goal of giving out 10,000 Shabbos candles over the course of the month. Many girls were inspired to make huge מ"ע pledges, with some pledging to give out as much as 250 צעי"ן ledges, with some pledging to give out as much as 250 יובש"ל The first 50 girls to pledge 150 נש"ק got to go on a מצוה tank during school.







#### NEW **AFTERNOON COURSES**

Aside from the basic math, science, history and English subjects taught, we strive to students provide our additional knowledge in every area possible. For this reason, we are excited to report that this year, in addition to our sought-after CPR course returning, students have also been offered valuable classes in Nutrition, Extended Math, and Extended Bio.

A long winter מוצאי שבת-transformed with this fantastic school-wide program! Every few weeks on מוצאי שבת, students brave the cold to join the warmth of unity, fun and action.
