

קריאה, math, and many skills that will take them far. We are so proud of our graduates!












Primary GRADES 1-3

Expertly juggling her roles both at home and in school, Mrs. Schildkraut didn't waste a moment. After her early arrival at school every day, she could be seen knitting near the elevator, greeting teachers, students and therapists.

Every day, Mrs. Schidkraut expertly "juggled" and wore so many different hats both at home and in school. She would knit near the elevator between her early arrival at school, with near perfect attendance, even as she taught until the very last day before Covid temporarily shut our doors.
















HATCHING CHICKS

As we excitedly count up to מתן תורה from eon until שבועות, Bais Rivkah Primary has a yearly tradition as the girls take part in another highly anticipated type of counting: 21 days of incubation, watching eggs turn into chicks!

With the help of Morah Liba Rapoport and Morah Sara Cohen, the eggs came to Bais Rivkah. From the farm on Day 1 and until Day 21, when 11 chicks hatched, the girls learned science concepts and powerful lessons in patience, caring, and an appreciation for 'מה רבו מעשיך.

What is behind the hundreds of beautiful portions that the kitchen serves several times a day? What happens behind those kitchen doors?



TELL US ABOUT YOURSELF. DID YOU ALWAYS THINK YOU WOULD BE A COOK?

S.B.: No. I used to teach in Israel, but I also taught cooking.

E.E.: I knew I would always be involved in food. I grew up in a Chabad House on a college campus, and I remember mixing a salad in a large bowl as a child. So I grew up cooking in large quantities, and it's always something I enjoyed.

E.E.: There are some major language barriers. Once, I asked someone to put almond milk in the refrigerator and he put it in the freezer. Often I try to say something and they don't understand at all.

WHAT'S ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT SKILLS YOU NEED AS A COOK?

S.B.: You need to be organized, otherwise you can not do this job. You have to plan ahead.

E.E.: Being able to delegate, manage your kitchen and keep it clean and sanitized

HOW DO YOU PROVIDE FOOD FOR SO MANY PEOPLE?

S.B.: We try our best

E.E.: "Try to work smarter not harder". We use a lot of machinery to speed things up.

WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE APPLIANCE IN THE KITCHEN?

S.B.: My big mixer. I also love my skillet. This skillet cooks 70-80 pounds of pasta per time. We also make soup in it.

E.E.: My Robot Coupe. It's like a food processor, but instead of the food going into a bowl, it shoots out from the side.

WHAT'S ONE THING PEOPLE DO NOT REALIZE?

S.B.: The amount of work you have to do to prepare each meal


E.E.: How much work it takes to run the kitchen. Also, we serve food 4 times a day. In between the kitchen staff is busy and the kitchen is closed:).
